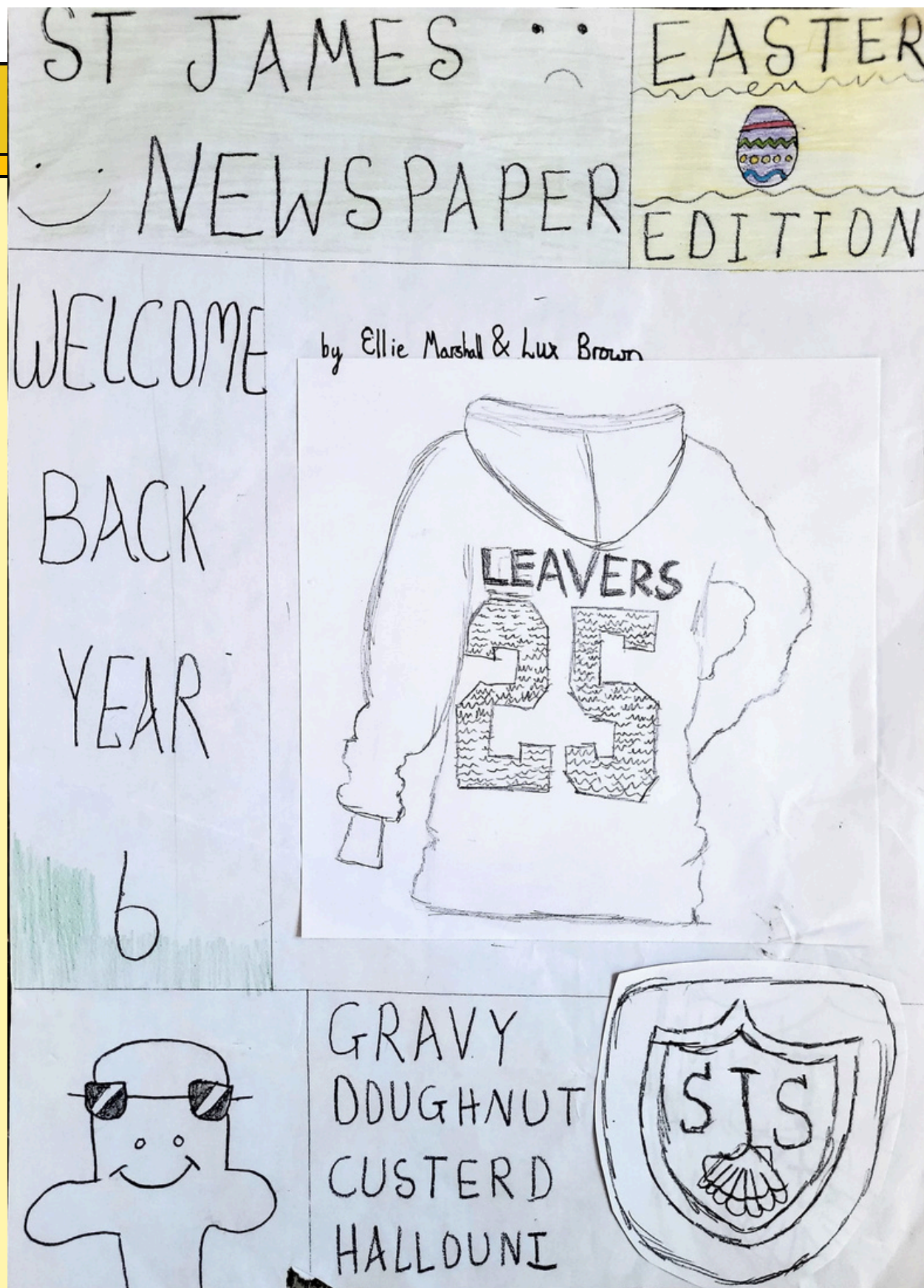

Hello everyone,

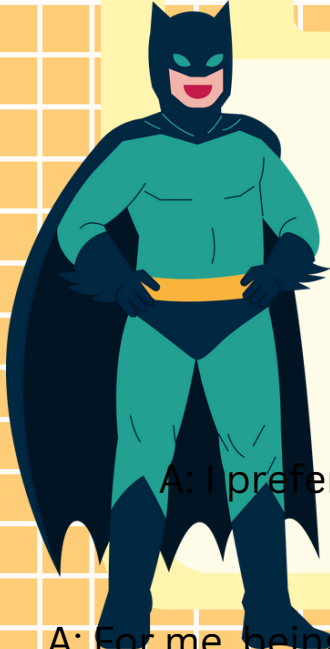

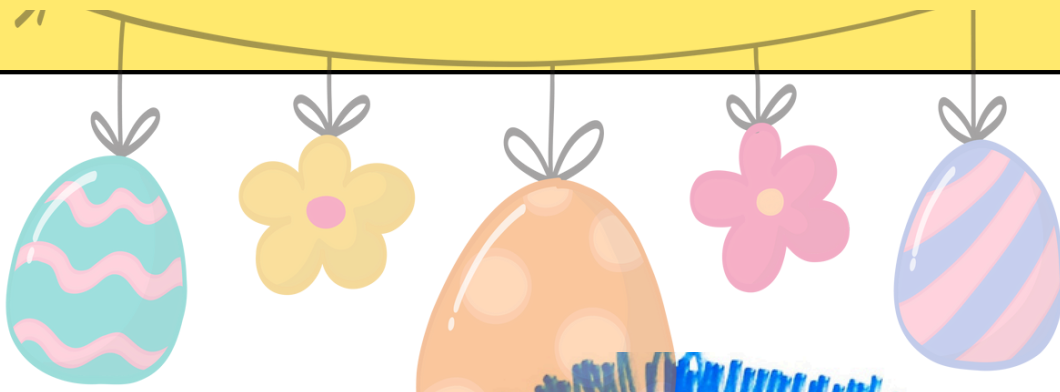


CREATIVE ARTWORK FROM RE DAY

The greatest light is glowing bright

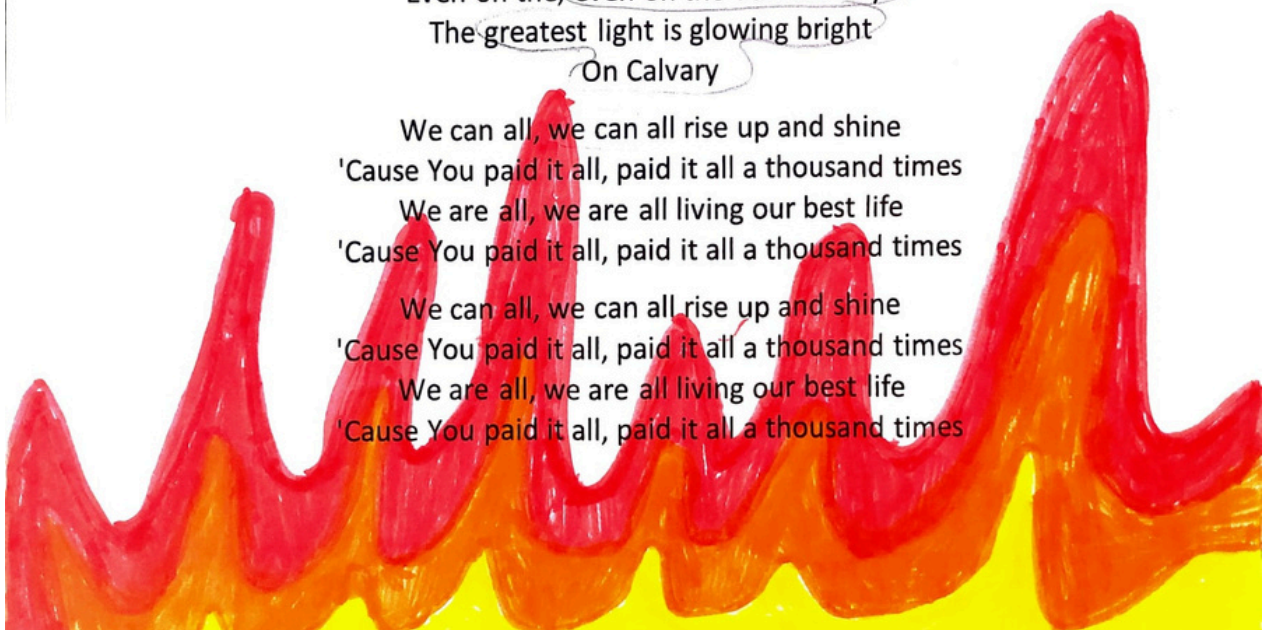
